Update of Ohio H.B. 66

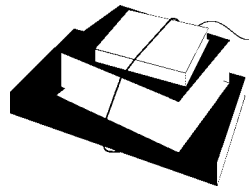
The provisions of Ohio's biennial budget bill, H.B. 66, affecting county law libraries have remained within the text of the bill that is expected to receive approval by the General Assembly and be signed by the Governor before July 1. With very little modification, a legislative Task Force will be convened by September 1, 2005, to examine the county law library system in Ohio and recommend changes in the funding, operation, and possibly governance of all law libraries, regardless of size or population served. The findings of the Task Force must be reported by October 31, 2006, prior to the January 1, 2007 reduction in the financial support currently provided by each county's treasury.

Retrieve briefs by case title.

Search for briefs by issue using either the Terms and Connectors or the Natural Language search method.

Check a citation in KeyCite to obtain a list of citing documents, including briefs and petitions.

Briefs are integrated with supporting information and research features on WESTLAW. Just click the hyper-text link to display the information you want to view, such as cases, dockets, or other briefs. You can also research Westlaw's *Profiler* information, which describes the experience and background of participating attorneys, judges, and expert witnesses.



Temporary changes to after-hours access -
