## *Preliminary Report on Ohio's Legislative Task Force on County Law Libraries*

Although the months are slipping by and some of the provisions of HB66, the state's 2005-2006 budget bill, that effectively eliminate the financial support provided to law libraries by county governments will be going into effect in January, 2007, the leadership of the examining Task Force remains optimistic that an agreement can be reached with the County Commissioners' Association of Ohio wherein enough county or state support can be designated for law libraries such as ours to remain open and to continue to serve their local legal communities.

Executives of the Ohio State Bar Association have remained diligent in their efforts to negotiate with the County Commissioners' Association on behalf of the law libraries and the Task Force Chair, the Hon. Charles Schneider of Franklin County, continues to encourage all parties involved to resolve issues with the intention of preparing a master list of resolutions that all the entities will be able to live with.

Foremost is the resolution that county law libraries exist to support the administration of justice and in doing so should, in part, be financially supported by government funds for the purpose of providing suitable space, staff, and information resources according to standards that may be established by the Supreme Court of Ohio.

The final report of the Task Force must be submitted to the legislature no later than October 31, 2007 and any implementing legislation regarding the continuation of governmental support would have to be in place before January 1, 2008. Due to the disparity among Ohio's counties in both size and population, it is hoped that legislation would provide for local variances in implementing any standards.

### *Lexis Training at the Law Library for 1 hour of CLE Credit*

On Monday, November 27, 2006, four, one-hour Lexis training sessions will be offered at the Law Library, at no cost. Each session has been approved by the Ohio Supreme Court for 1 hour of CLE credit. In the Library's media center, LexisNexis Applications Consultant Wendy Ramsey will teach the Lexis I session from 9:00 – 10:00 A.M. and again from 1:00 – 2:00 P.M. She will teach the Lexis II session from 10:15 – 11:15 A.M. and from 2:15–3:15 P.M. If necessary, additional sessions may be scheduled.

A sign-up sheet has been posted on the bulletin board in the media center, or you may register by calling the Law Library (225-4496) and request to be included in one of the sessions. Following is a description of both types of sessions.

#### Lexis I

This class provides a basic working knowledge of the LexisNexis services. Skills included are how to develop a search request, find cases and other documents by topic and find cases by cite or by party names. In addition, you learn to use SHEPARD'S ® Citation Service to determine that your cases are "good law."

#### Lexis II

Building on the techniques learned in the introductory class, this session emphasizes time efficient and cost-effective searching tips. Skills include how to bypass menu screens using short cuts, narrow searching with segments, focus on a specific word(s) within an original search and refine searches with advanced connectors.
