LexisNexis and Westlaw Training at the Law Library for 1 hour of CLE Credit

RECENT CHANGES TO WESTLAW SUBSCRIPTION

A *Patron-Access* subscription is now required by Thomson/West for libraries that allow access to WESTLAW databases by library users. In general, access to the most often used databases remains unchanged; however, effective immediately, library patrons logged-on to WESTLAW are no longer permitted to e-mail documents to home or office e-mail accounts. Instructions have been posted for users who wish to save documents in an electronic format and, as always, a citation list may be given to any staff member who will then e-mail documents from a staff computer.

A recent enhancement to the law library's WESTLAW account has been the addition of the *Ohio DUI Practitioner Library* which is available at all patron workstations.

BNA's Electronic Labor and Employment Law Service

Available on Workstation #7 in the Library's Media Center is an electronic subscription to BNA's Labor and Employment Law Service. This service provides access to all of the Labor Relations Reporter documents and opinions as well as those found in the segments of *Labor Arbitration*, *Fair Employment Practices*, *Americans with Disabilities*, *Individual Employment Rights*, and *Wages & Hours*. Regularly published highlights for this service are copied and filed in a notebook available on the shelving behind the circulation desk.
